In the month of February we celebrate two feasts of Marian significance. The first is the Presentation of the Lord. So far, the State Council has invited 1203 men to join our Councils, 766 of those men joined through the Online Membership Platform with a transfer rate of 49.09%. Historically, we have transfer rate of 63-65% members joining new Councils and we as a group need to do better in this category. Another area that NEEDS improvement is the number of Councils that are NOT recruiting. We as a jurisdiction have 527 Active Councils, with only 231 of our Council recruiting as on 1-26-25. To improve all our Councils' recruitment chances to succeed, we have begun using Facebook for business and using that to send specific messaging targeting prospective members in areas of our Conferences that need a recruitment boost. Our testing shows that we are reaching more potential members than we have ever reached before, and the Membership Team and the State Deputy believe that this tool be a GAME CHANGER, and it will increase our Council's chances to make their membership quota.

As a further incentive the State Deputy has authorized a continuation of the Council incentive which will see the top 5 recruiting councils that achieve the highest percentage to goal in the third quarter will receive a 5% discount on their fourth quarter per capita.

We have a lot of work to do, and I Firmly Believe that we can achieve this and to coin a phrase, you should know that I am Rooting for You! Vivat Jesus!












NYS Cardinals Annual Pro Life Mass at St. Patrick's January 26th 2025

On January 26th Members of the NYS Council attended the annual pro Life Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral. The Mass was celebrated by Cardinal Dolan.



Who is St. Valentine and why do we Celebrate Valentine's Day on February 14th?

Saint Valentine is the patron saint of love. Believers say God worked through his life to perform miracles and teach people how to recognize and experience true love.

Saint Valentine was a Catholic priest who had also worked as a doctor. He lived in Italy during the third century AD and served as a priest in Rome. Historians don't know much about Valentine's early life. They pick up Valentine's story after he began working as a priest. Valentine became famous for marrying couples who were in love but couldn't get legally married in Rome during the reign of Emperor Claudius II, who outlawed weddings. Claudius wanted to recruit lots of men to be soldiers in his army and thought that marriage would be an obstacle to recruiting new soldiers. He also wanted to prevent his existing soldiers from getting married because he thought that marriage would distract them from their work. When Emperor Claudius discovered that Valentine was performing weddings, he sent Valentine to jail. Valentine used his time in jail to continue to reach out to people with the love that he said Jesus Christ gave him for others.

He befriended his jailer, Asterious, who became so impressed with Valentine's wisdom that he asked Valentine to help his daughter, Julia, with her lessons. Julia was blind and needed someone to read material for her to learn it. Valentine became friends with Julia through his work with her when she came to visit him in jail. Emperor Claudius also came to like Valentine. He offered to pardon Valentine and set him free if Valentine would renounce his Christian faith and agree to worship the Roman gods. Not only did Valentine refuse to leave his faith, he also encouraged Emperor Claudius to place his trust in Christ. Valentine's faithful choices cost him his life. Emperor Claudius was so enraged at Valentine's response that he sentenced Valentine to die. Before he was killed, Valentine wrote a last note to encourage Julia to stay close to Jesus and to thank her for being his friend. He signed the note: "From your Valentine." That note inspired people to begin writing their own loving messages to people on Valentine's Feast Day, February 14th, known as Valentine's Day Cards, which is celebrated on the same day on which Valentine was martyred (it is also celebrated by Hallmark). Valentine was beaten, stoned, and beheaded on February 14, 270. People who remembered his loving service to many young couples began celebrating his life, and he came to be regarded as a saint through whom God had worked to help people in miraculous ways. By 496, Pope Gelasius designated February 14th as Valentine's official feast day.

The most famous miracle attributed to Saint Valentine involved the farewell note that he sent to Julia. Believers say that God miraculously cured Julia of her blindness so that she could personally read Valentine's note, rather than just have someone else read it to her. Throughout the years since Valentine died, people have **prayed** for him to intercede for them before God about their romantic lives. Numerous couples have reported experiencing miraculous improvements in their relationships with boyfriends, girlfriends, and spouses after praying for help from St. Valentine. Flowers and Candy also apparently help as well.



Brothers – It's great to hear about all of the local Free Throws that are taking place all throughout the State! Just a few reminders:

- **Do not use the old two-sided participant forms**. Click on this link for the 1598 score sheet that you should be using. They should also be included in the new Free-Throw kits if you order one.
- Make sure that you are up-to-date on the program and rules. <u>Free-Throw</u> <u>Championship Playbook</u> Here are a few important ones
 - Age is determined as of January 1, 2025 NOT their age when your event is held.
 - Council Level participants shoot 15 baskets
 - District Level and above participants shoot 25 baskets
 - Ties at all levels must be broken.
 - To break a tie, contestants take a second round of five free throws. No warm-up tosses are permitted for the tie-breaker rounds. Successive rounds of five free throws each continue until a winner emerges.

• Rules for proof of age/gender: "Paperwork that determines age eligibility of participants **should not be collected or copied.**" So, have them bring and show proof, but **do not make or attach copies of birth certificates or passports to**

the score sheets. You can simply note on the score sheet that their eligibility has been verified.

Note: I have verified with our State Advocate, State Deputy and the Director at Supreme for the Free-Throw Championship that we still use the information on the Birth Certificate.

Supplies are available through Supplies Online: Free Throw Kit (FT-KIT-E) Free-Throw participant patches (FT-P-E). You can get 25 patches for \$15.25 District Deputies should order Free-Throw Medals if needed



The Blessed Michael J. McGivney Church Statue Initiative



Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, **Blessed Michael McGivney**, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor. We humbly ask that you glorify **Blessed Michael McGivney** on earth according to the design of your holy will. Through his intersession, grant the favor I now present (here make your request). Through Christ our Lord. Amen



The Father Michael J. McGivney Guild promotes the cause for sainthood of the founder of the Knights of Columbus, who was beatified on Oct. 31, 2020. Members of the Guild, and anyone devoted to Father McGivney, can play an active role in the cause by praying for his intercession in times of need, especially in cases of serious illness, and reporting to the Guild any favors received.

Membership in the Guild is free and open to anyone who is devoted to Father McGivney and wishes to invoke his intercession and assist in his sainthood cause through prayer. Members receive a quarterly newsletter and are remembered in a weekly Mass offered for their intentions.

Catholic men who wish to live out the vision and mission of Father McGivney are invited to join the Knights of Columbus and become part of a network of charity, unity and fraternity that serves local parishes and communities. Father McGivney founded the Knights of Columbus in 1882 in New Haven, Conn., and died at the age of 38 in 1890. His cause for sainthood was opened in 1997, and his heroic virtue was recognized by the Vatican in March 2008, when he was declared a Venerable Servant of God by Pope Benedict XVI.

On May 26, 2020, Father McGivney took another step toward sainthood when Pope Francis approved the promulgation of a decree recognizing a miracle attributed to his intercession. With the approval of this miracle, he was beatified on Oct. 31, 2020, with the title of Blessed.

Another miracle through his intercession is needed for him to be canonized as a saint.

Those devoted to Father McGivney are encouraged to recite regularly the prayer for his canonization, which is available online and on a special prayer card. You may Report favors through this website or by email or regular mail at the addresses listed below.
